

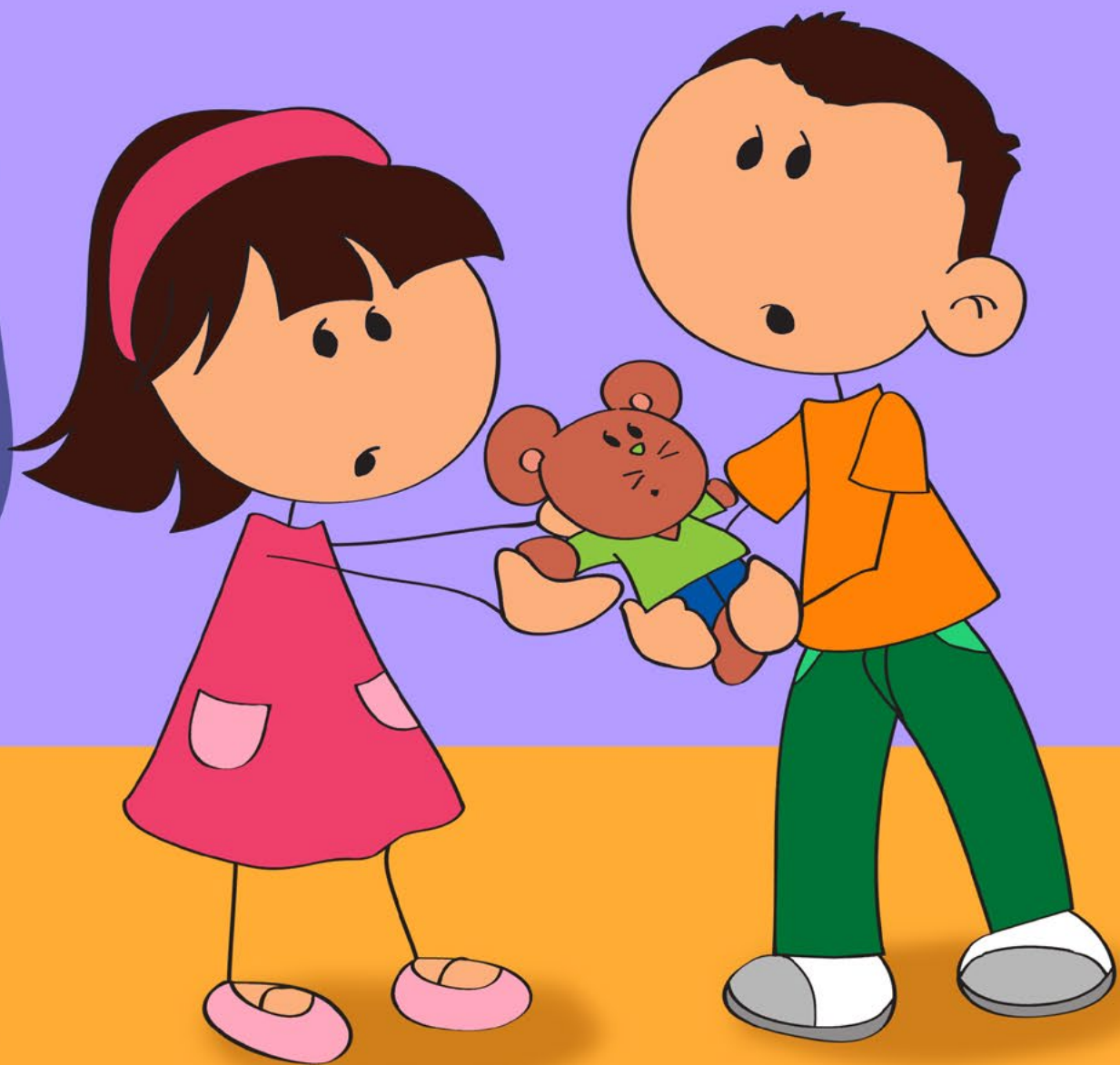
*I like to play with


“Hmm,” Mom says, “It’s not fair to give me your problem. I’ve already got lots of problems to take care of. I think that you can come up with a solution.”



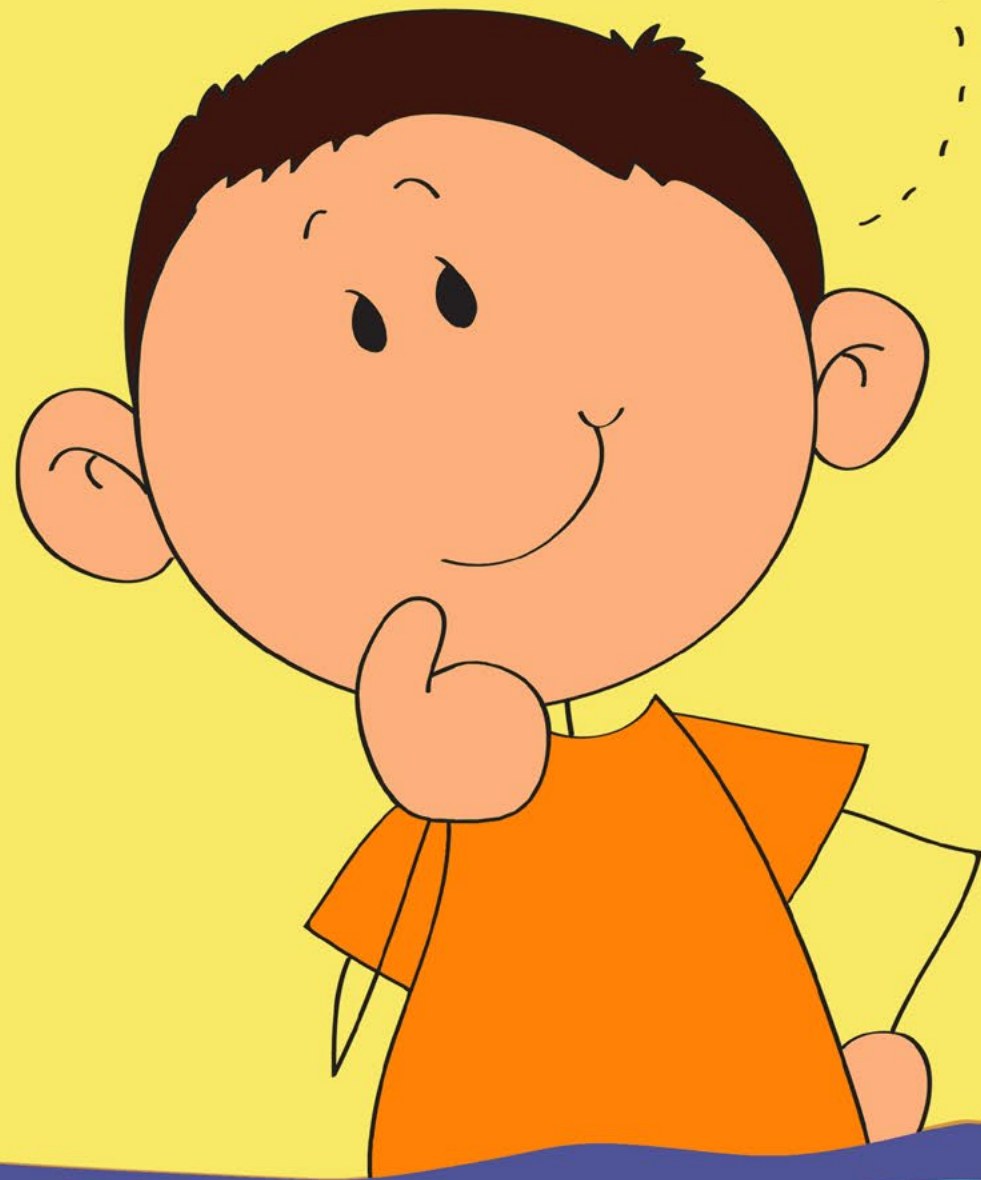
*But, I don't know how to
