**GRUNT! GRUNT!**

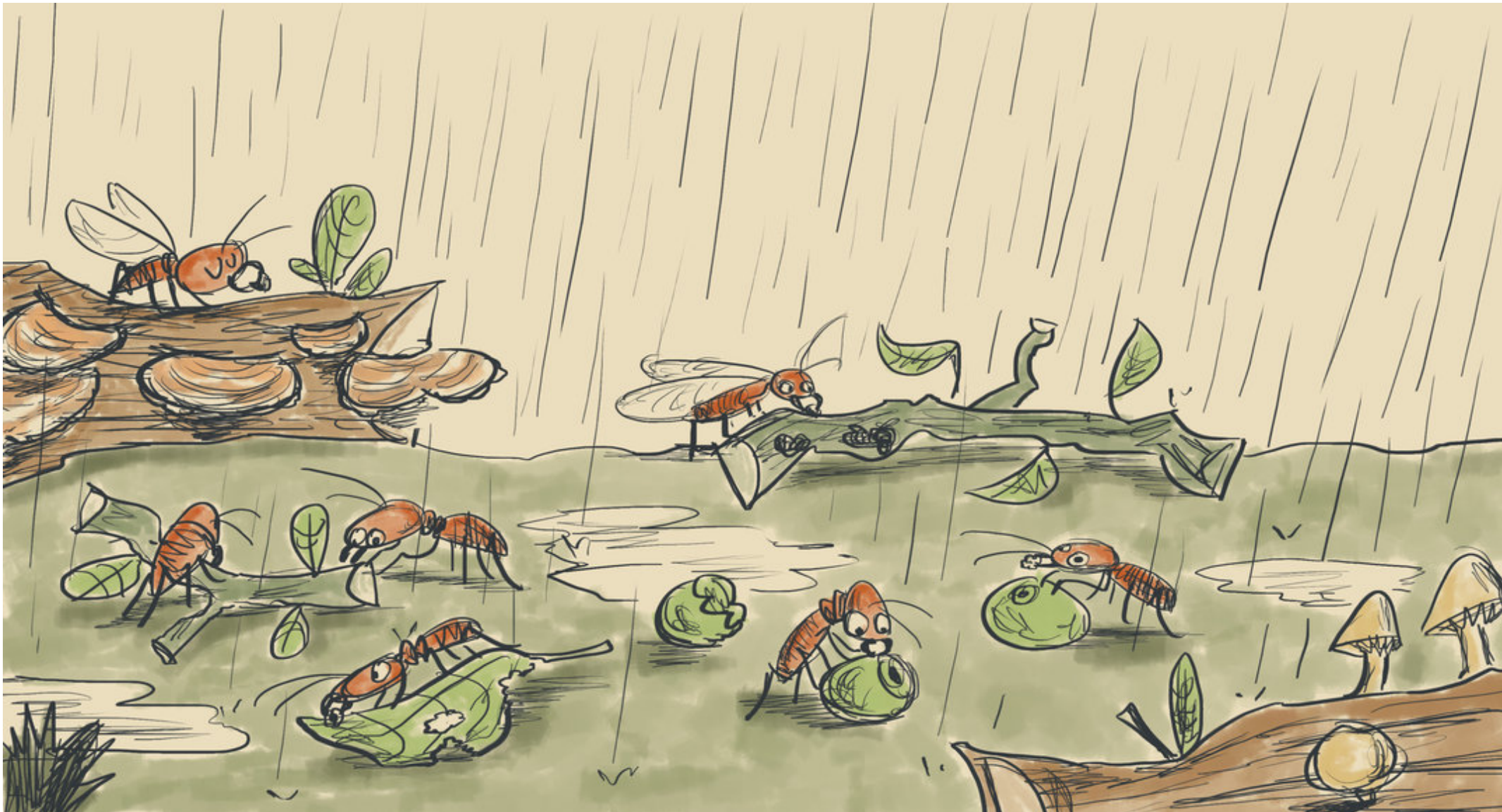


When elephants poop in the forest,

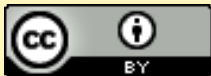
