Jeenu thinks, then she smiles. "It is a smiley face!" she says.


Ajji claps. "You understood the game!"

Ajji draws another shape. "A triangle!" Jeenu shouts. Then she laughs. "Look what I have made!"







"Well done, Jeenu!" says Ajji. "Look who has come to play with us!"




"Do you want a tree near your window?" asks Ajji.


"Yes Ajji, thank you!" says Jeenu.
