She cherished it and had it by her side at all times.




She felt good having it close by and looked at it often.

It was a beautiful flower, it made her feel good all day. Why couldn't she sleep well at night?






The birds payed the rabbit a visit one day

I don't want it any longer, it's lost its charm. Charm? What do you mean rabbit? the birds asked.


There is beauty everywhere, the rabbit responded, and in every season.

Look




The lakes are beautiful
