

# How to Be an Otter



You will live in a group, as a family. You will hunt and play together. You will also protect each other.





The elders of the family will guard the pups. Listen to the elders, for they know the river well. The river is also your playground. Here, you will have sand to dig, places to hide, and rocks to nap on.

Learn to share your space. You will have to share the river with large herons, shy turtles, peaceful pelicans, honking ducks and moody mugger crocodiles.

The mugger crocodiles prefer to be left alone. DO NOT disturb them!

The fisherman can be your friend, but watch out for his nets. Like us, the fisherman needs to catch fish to feed his family. Keep away from him, and he will keep away from you. Stay away from anything that does not belong to the river—it could be a trap. Do not be curious about shiny, metallic objects.



The river will keep changing. Your favourite sandbank may disappear tomorrow, just asit may return after the rainy season. You have to learn quickly and trust your instincts. And remember, the river will always be your home.
