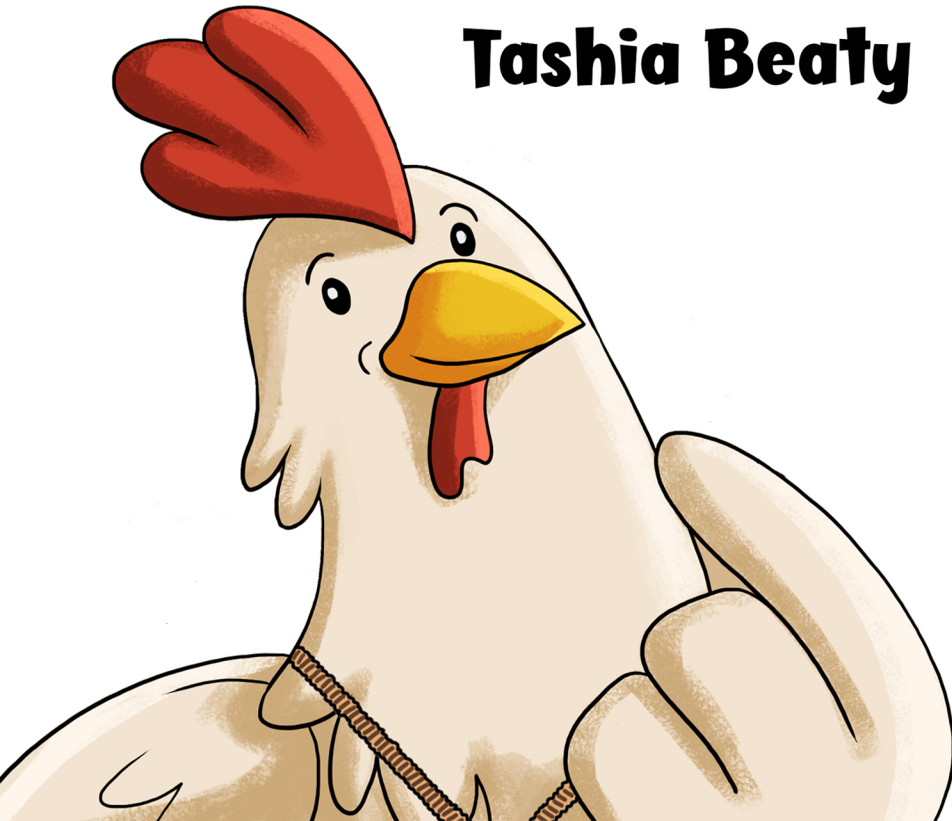


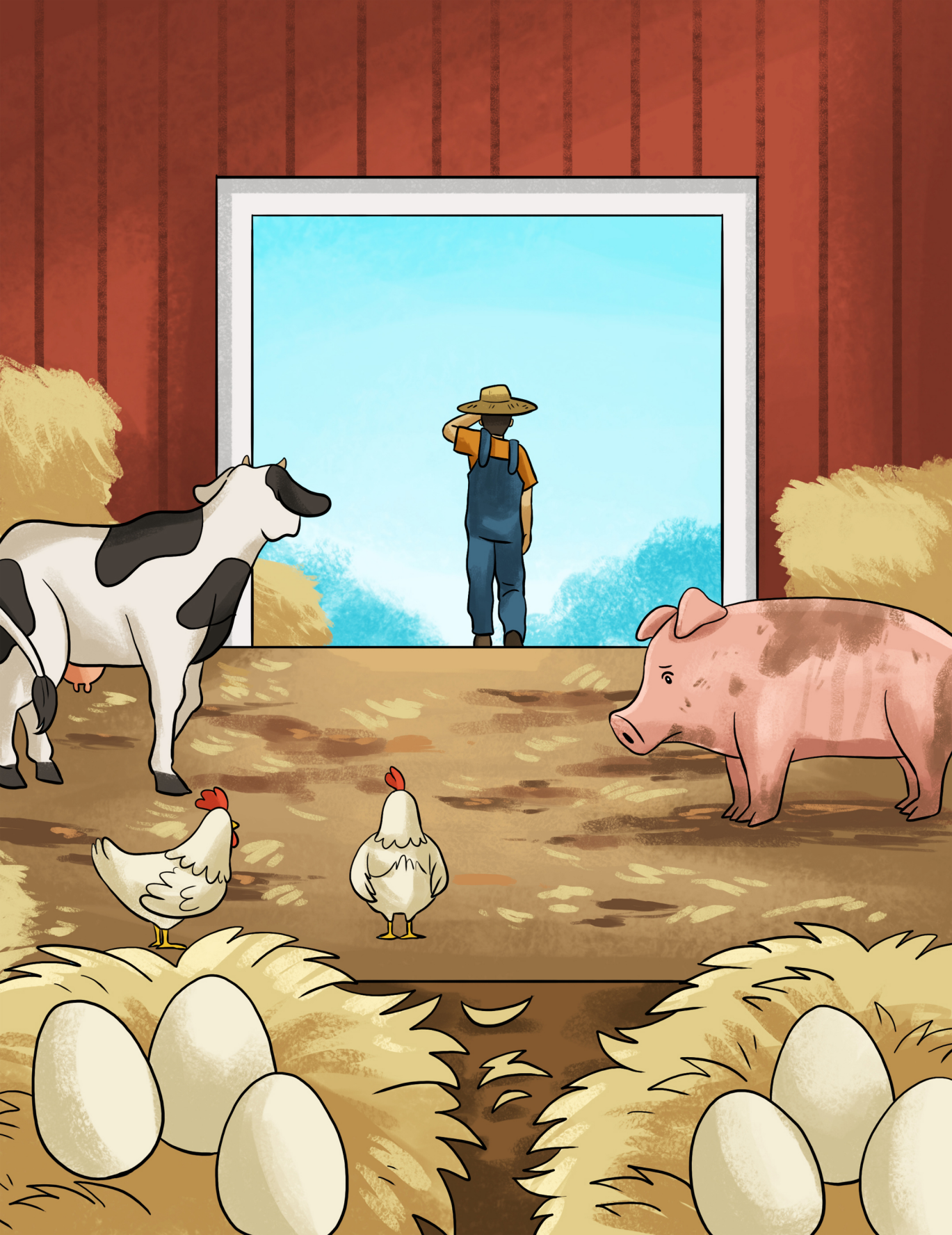
Squilly Fixes the List in the Mist

numbers are all jumbled in a mist.*




