


Mr Earthworm Wants a Bath - Early STEM






Mr Earthworm is very angry.


He likes looking pretty, and is fed up of being covered in mud and never being able to have a proper bath.




So he asks his wife, who is very handy with tools,
to install a bathtub with running water.




The bathtub is easy to make. First Mrs Earthworm finds an old flower pot lying in the kitchen garden. She patches up the few holes and some gaps.
And it's done!






She improved the device by connecting a garden hose directly onto a drainpipe. However, the flow was not quite satisfactory.




Mrs Earthworm thought hard. Then she found another bowl to collect the water. She made a knot to act as a tap. Now the water supply was perfect.




The next problem was that this water was not suitable for Mr Earthworm. It had too much residue, is not clear enough, and it does not smell good.




Mrs Earthworm had listened carefully in Science class, and so she knew how to make a filter using sand, seeds, and stones.

Now it's perfect!


Mr Earthworm can finally relax in the bath that he so wanted so much.




