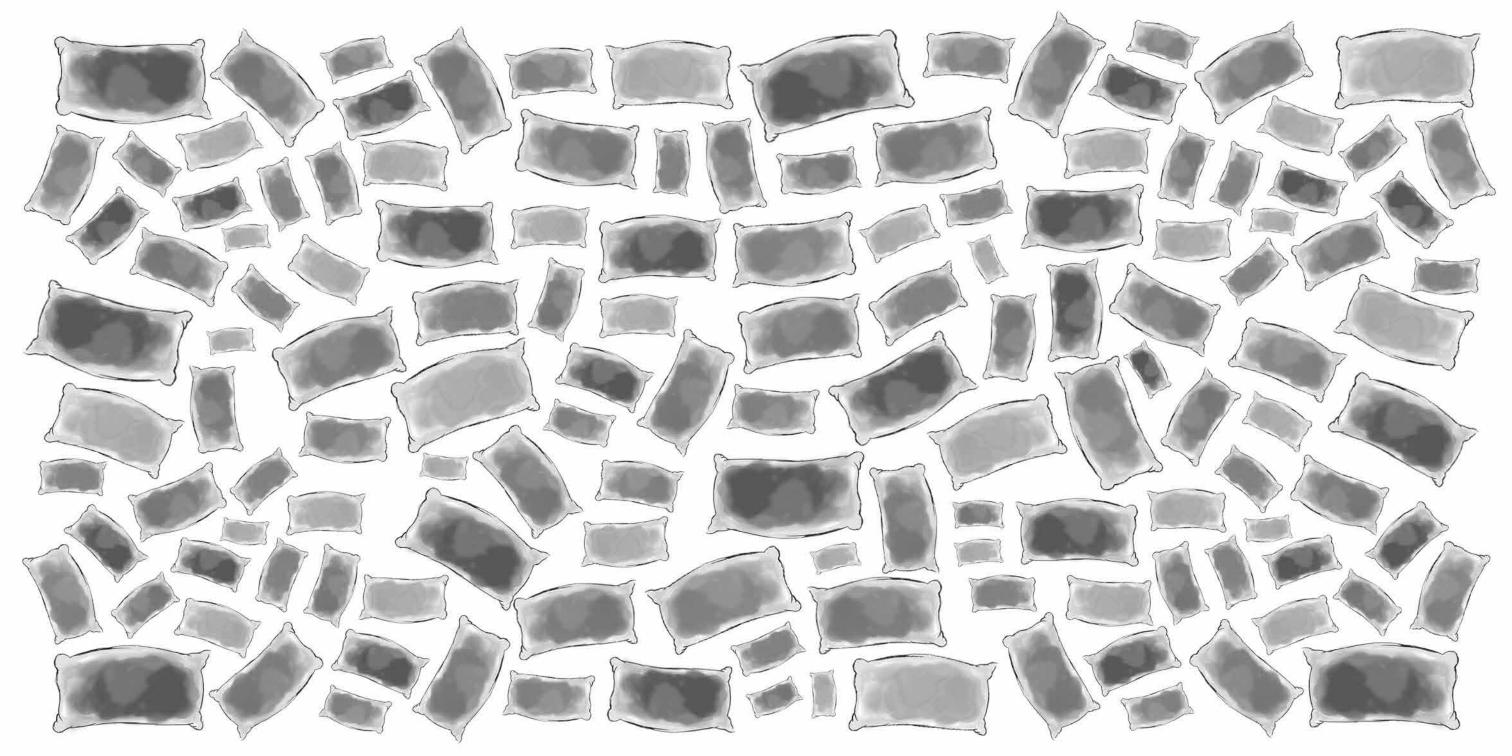

"Let's write down all your best stories, fold up the paper and tuck it inside the pillow."



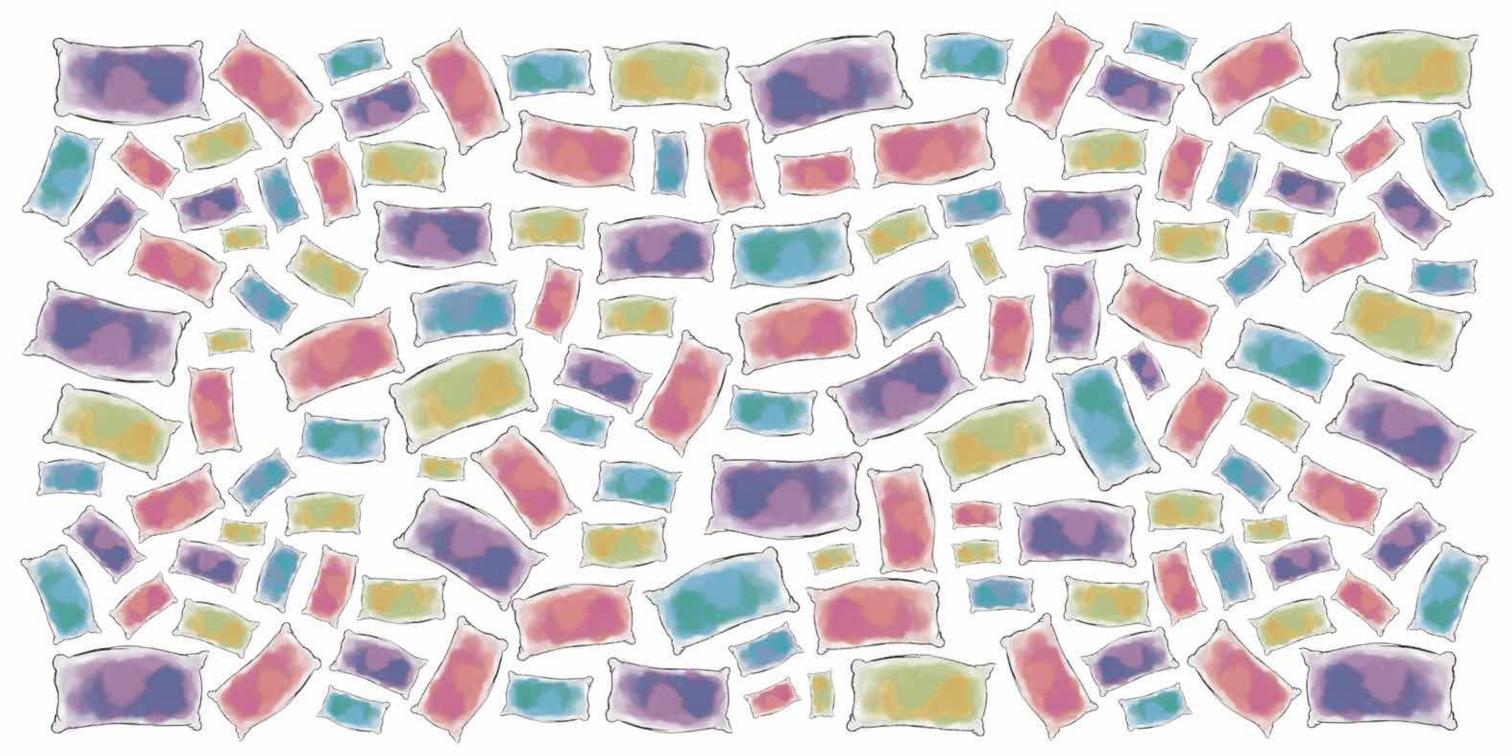
