

When I go shopping...




I do not use plastic bags but I use cloth bags instead.

When I see other people littering...




I remind them of the right thing to do.



I always turn off the lights when I am the last person to leave the room.




I do not overfill my plate, so I do not waste food.

I turn off the tap while brushing my teeth, to make sure I do not waste water.


Water is precious.

or walk.




I save our trees by drawing on both sides of the paper.



I plant herbs and flowers in the garden and help to keep our earth green...




I water them to help them grow.
