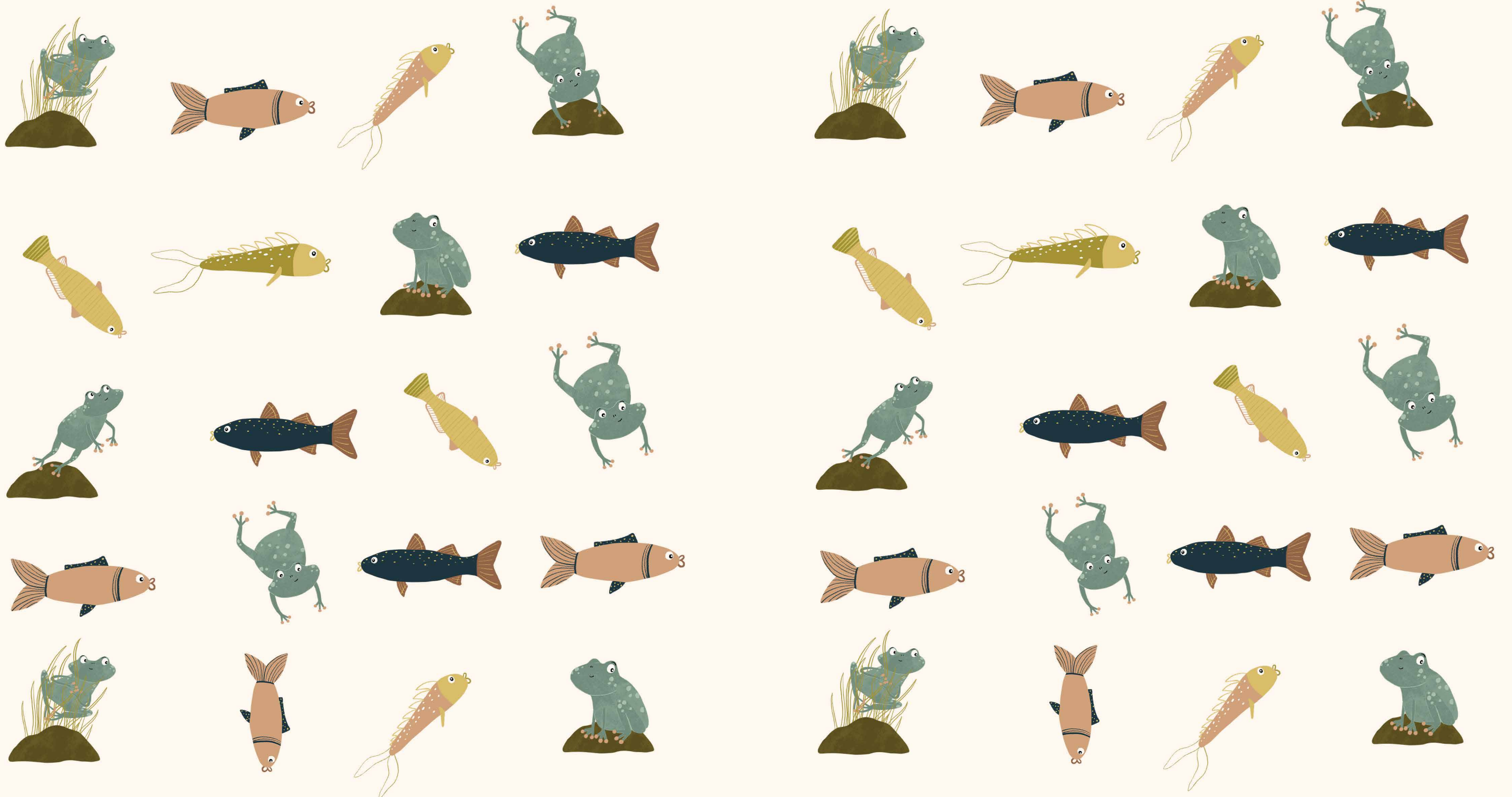

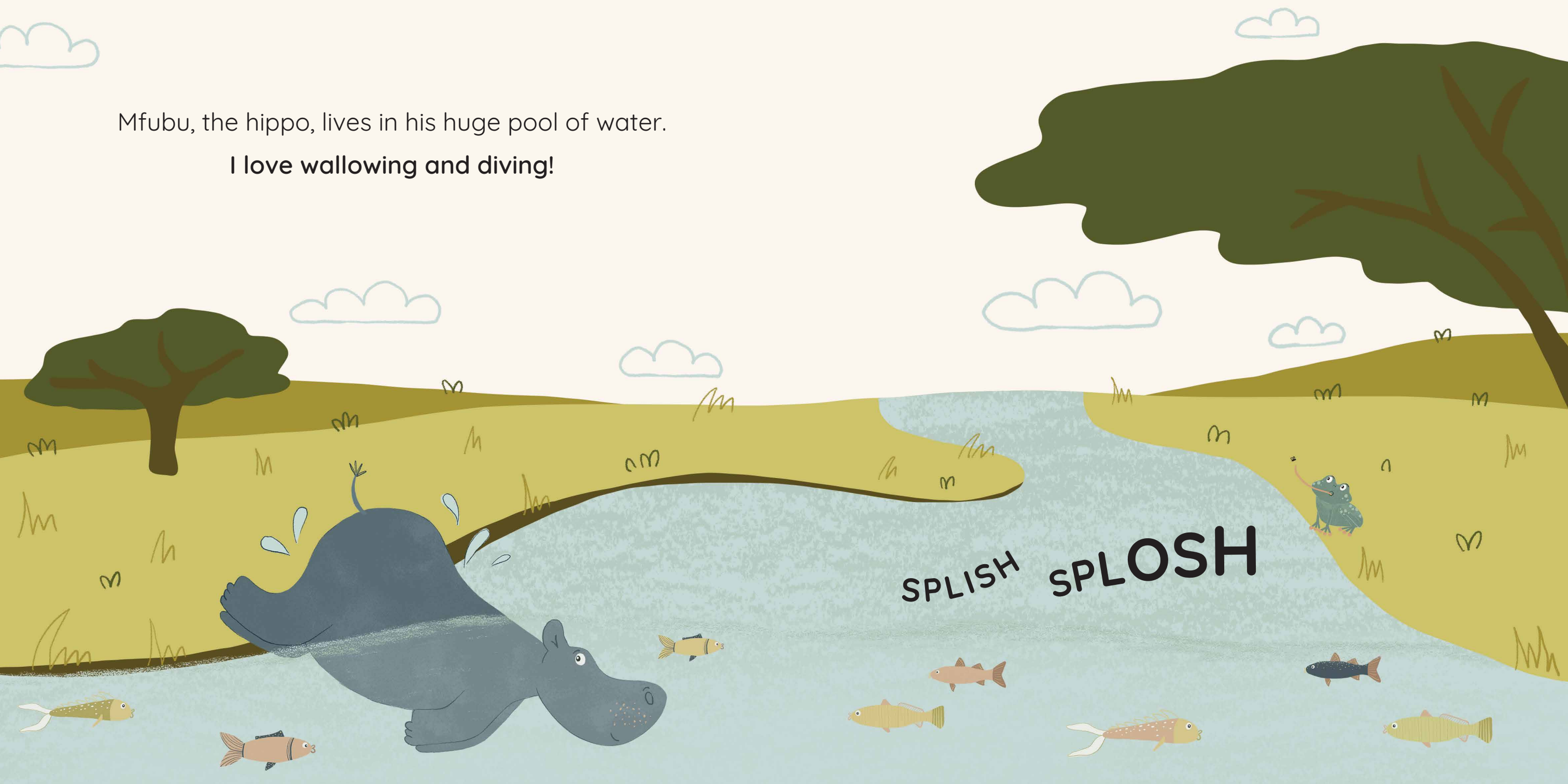

to see if we can find the problem.



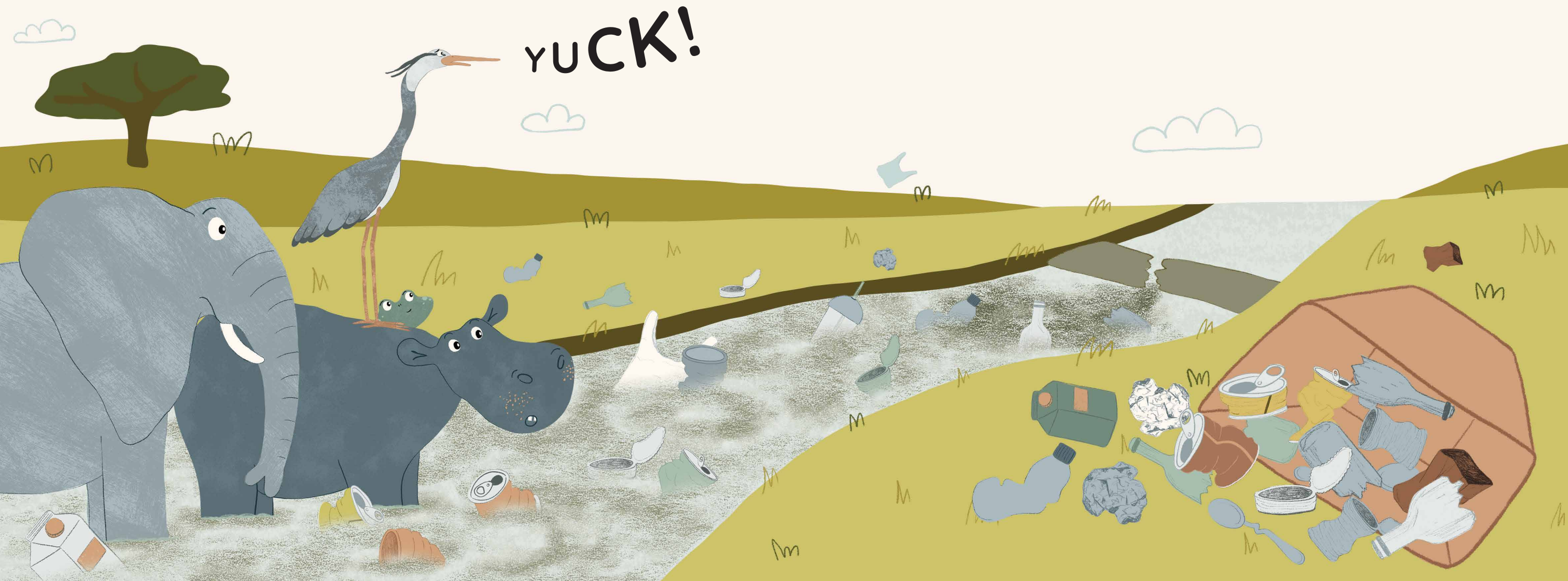
SPURT

It makes us sick.

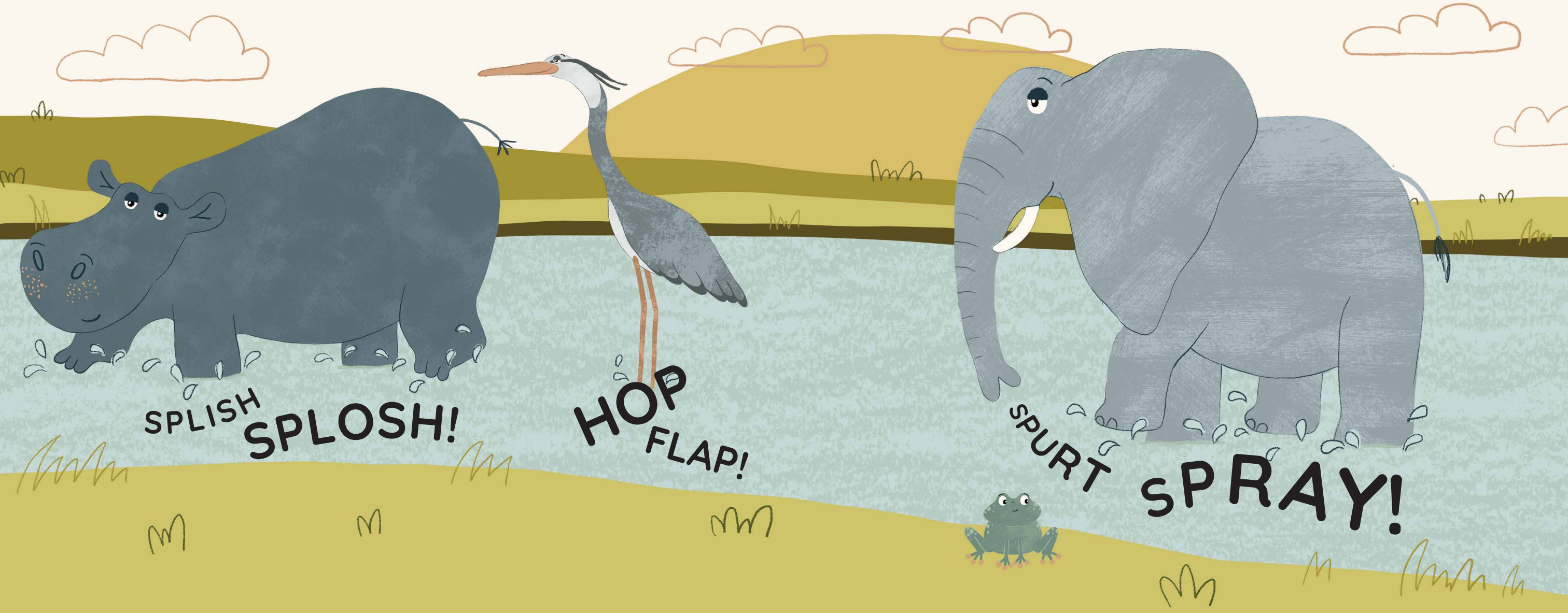


We're so sorry! We must get help to fix this.

And now we can go home.





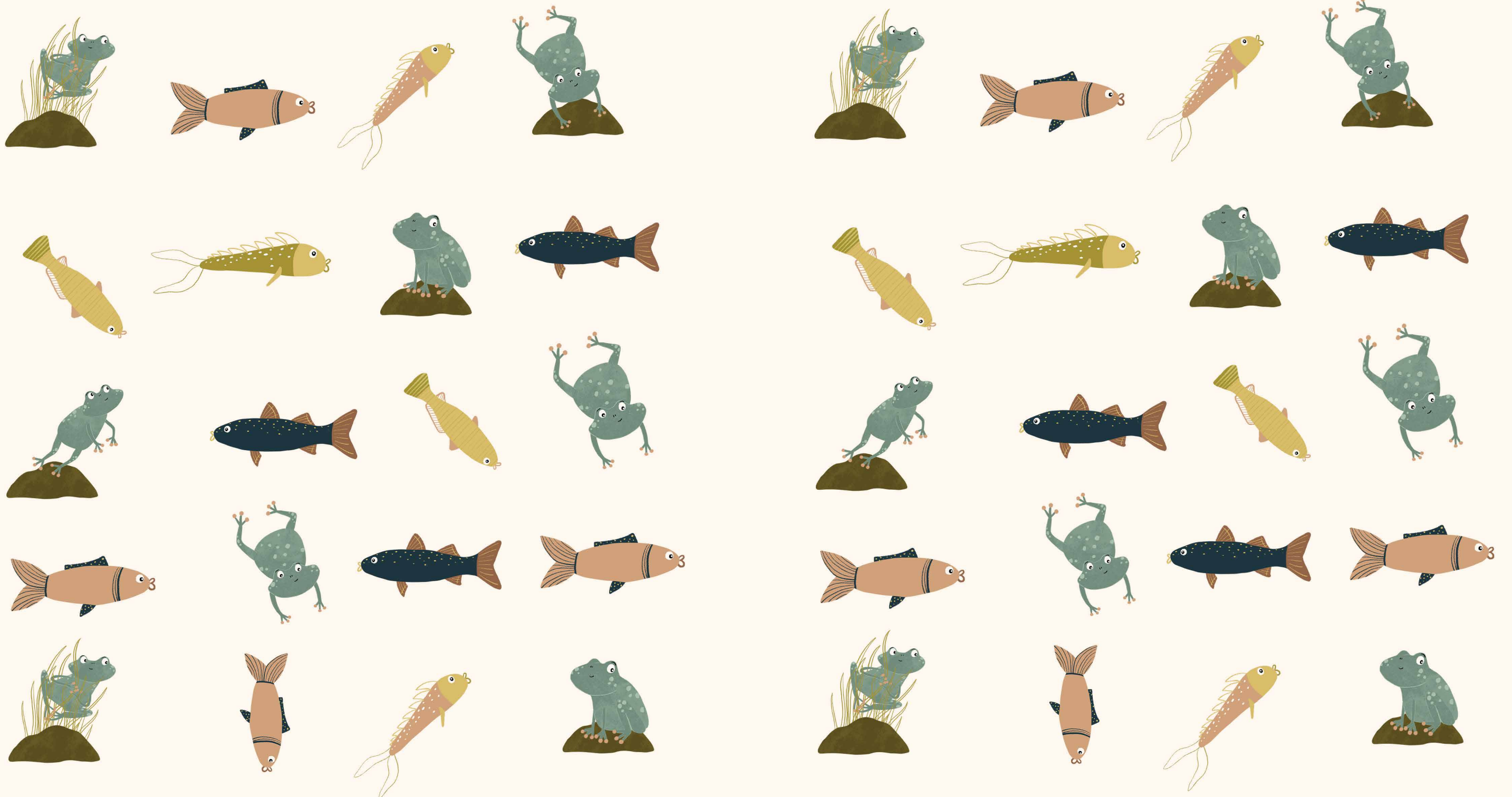
Guess what?
